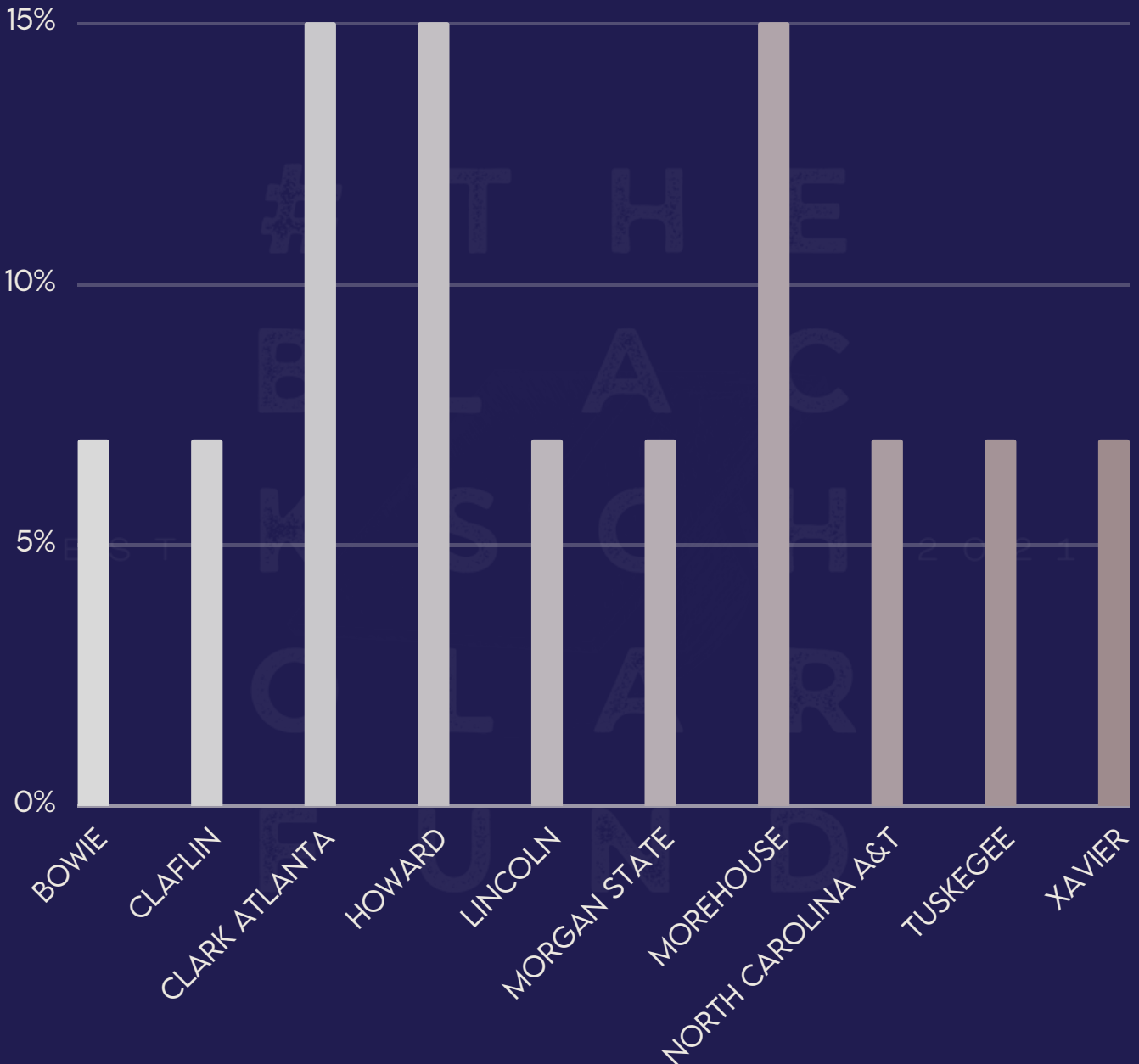


Figure 1.3 reflects the HBCU of choice for inaugural year scholars,

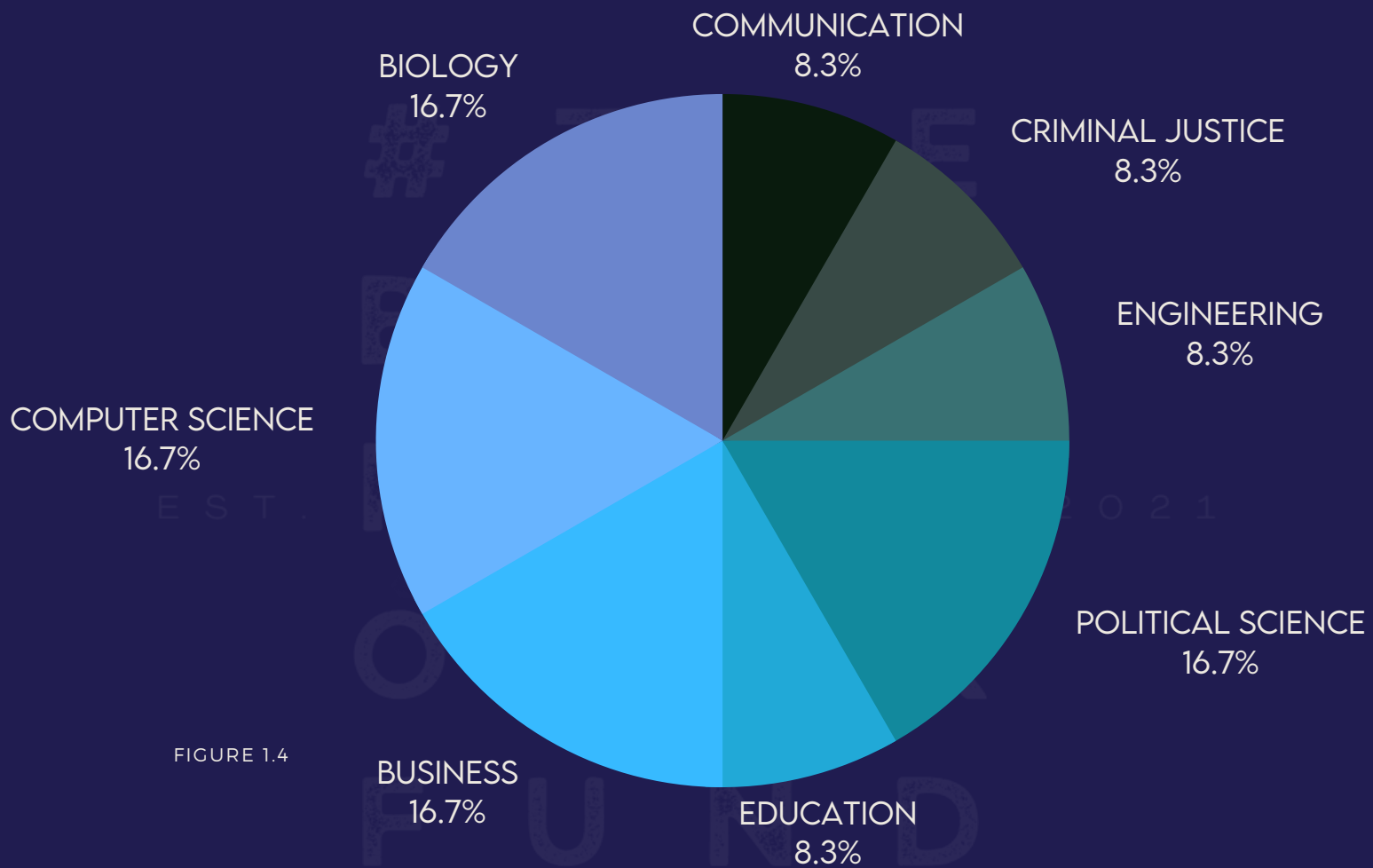

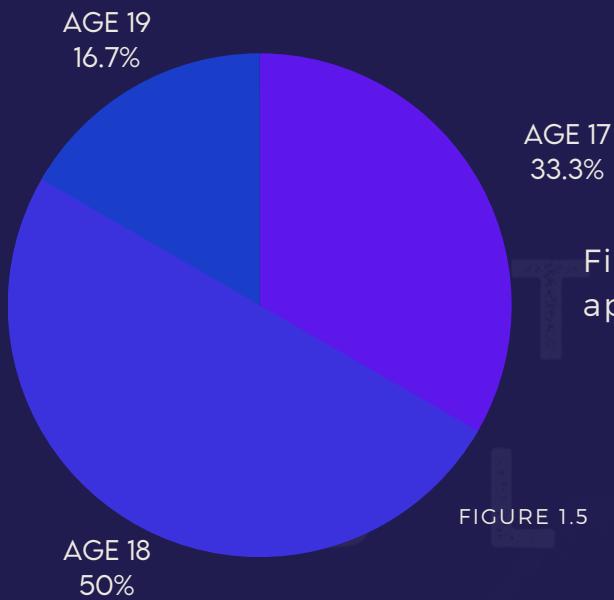


Figure 1.5 shows the self-identified age of applicants.

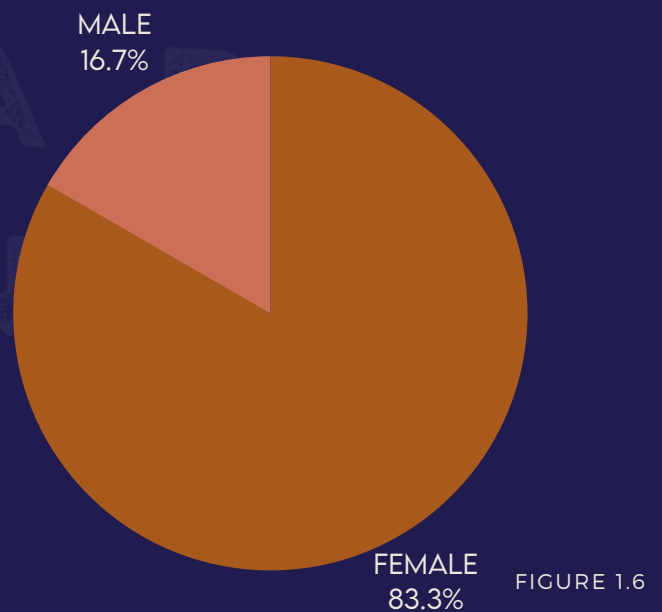

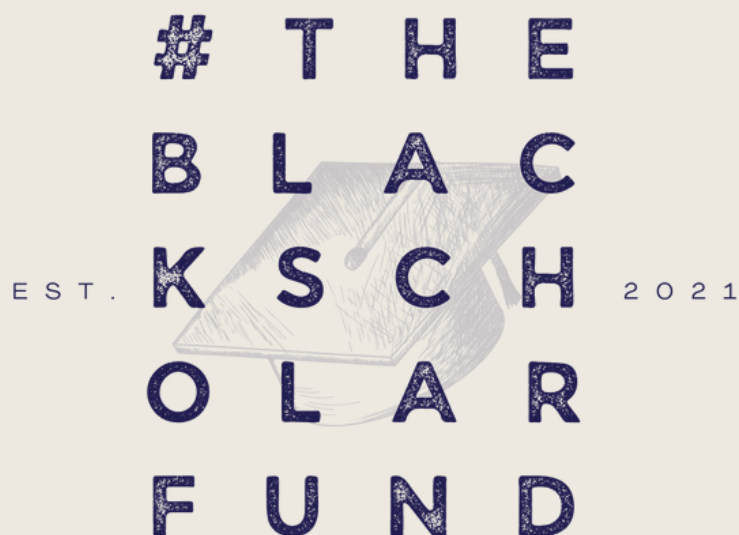
